NOTICE is hereby given that the **51st** Annual General Meeting of Members of **Perfectpac Limited** will be held on **Monday**, the **18th day of September**, **2023** at **03:00 P.M. (IST)** through Video Conferencing ('VC')/Other Audio Visual Means ('OAVM') to transact the following business:-

ORDINARY BUSINESS

- 1. To consider and adopt the Audited Financial Statements of the Company for the Financial Year ended March 31, 2023, together with the Reports of the Board of Directors and Auditors thereon.
- 2. To declare a Final Dividend of Re. 1.00/- per equity share (i.e. 50%) on face value of Rs. 2/- per share for the Financial Year 2022-23.
- **3.** To appoint a Director in place of Shri Rajendra Kumar Rajgarhia (DIN: 00141766), who retires by rotation and, being eligible, offers himself for re-appointment.

To consider and if thought fit, to pass the following resolution as Special Resolution:-

"**RESOLVED THAT** pursuant to the provisions of Section 152 and other applicable provisions, if any, of the Companies Act, 2013 read with the Companies (Appointment and Qualification of Directors) Rules, 2014, the Articles of Association of the Company and Regulation 17(1A) of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (including any statutory modification(s) or re-enactment(s) thereof, for the time being in force), consent of the members of the Company be and is hereby accorded to the re-appointment of Shri Rajendra Kumar Rajgarhia (DIN: 00141766), Non-Executive Director who has attained the age of 75 (seventy five) years and retires from office by rotation and being eligible, offers himself for re-appointment as a Non-Executive Director of the Company, liable to retire by rotation.

SPECIAL BUSINESS

4. To Re-appoint Shri Sanjay Rajgarhia (DIN: 00154167) as Managing Director on the Board of the Company

To consider and if thought fit, to pass the following resolution as Special Resolution:-

"RESOLVED THAT pursuant to the provisions of Sections 196, 197, 198, 203, Schedule V and other applicable provisions, if any, of the Companies Act, 2013 ('the Act') and the Rules made thereunder, including the Companies (Appointment and Remuneration of Managerial Personnel) Rules, 2014, applicable provisions of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 and all other applicable laws (in each case, including any statutory modification(s) or re-enactment(s) thereof, for the time being in force), Articles of Association of the Company, Nomination and Remuneration Policy of the Company and on the recommendation of the Nomination and Remuneration Committee of the Company and approval of the Board of Directors of the Company and such other approvals, consents, permissions and sanctions as may be necessary, the consent of the members of the Company be and is hereby accorded to the re-appointment of Shri Sanjay Rajgarhia (DIN: 00154167) as Managing Director, on the Board of the Company with effect from July 01, 2024, for further period of 3 years (three years), on following terms and conditions including remuneration:-

Basic Salary:- Rs. 6,00,000/- (Rupees Six Lakhs) per month w.e.f. July 01, 2024 with such increase as may be decided by the Board of Directors from time to time, but subject to maximum salary of Rs 7,00,000 (Rupees Seven Lakhs) per month.

Perquisites and Allowances:- In addition, following perquisites and allowances shall be payable:-

 Rent free furnished residential accommodation with free electricity the monetary value of which will be evaluated as per Rules 3 of the Income Tax Rules, 1962.

OR

In case own premises are occupied, then house rent allowance payable as per rules of the Company but not exceeding 60% of Basic Salary per month. The expenses on electricity will be borne by the Company.

 Medical Benefits:- The total cost of medical expenses / allowance to the Company shall not exceed one month basic salary per year.

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- (iii) Leave Travel Allowance/ Concession:- For self and family once in a year shall not exceed one month basic salary per year.
- (iv) Reimbursement of membership fees in respect of Clubs will be subject to maximum of two Clubs.
- (v) Personal Accident / Mediclaim Insurance Premium subject to limit of Rs. 25,000/- per annum.
- (vi) The Company's contribution towards Provident Fund as per rules of the Company.
- (vii) Gratuity and Leave Encashment as per rules of the Company.
- (viii) Free use of the Company's car with driver for official as well as for personal purposes.
- (ix) Telephone at residence, Internet, gas bill, gardener expenses at Company's cost.

Other Terms & Conditions:-

- No sitting fees will be paid to Shri Sanjay Rajgarhia for attending the meetings of Board of Directors or Committees thereof.
- (ii) Shri Sanjay Rajgarhia shall not liable to retire by rotation.
- (iii) Shri Sanjay Rajgarhia will perform the duties and exercise the powers, which from time to time may be assigned to or vested in him by the Board of Directors of the Company.
- (iv) Shri Sanjay Rajgarhia can resign from the services of the Company at any time by giving three months' notice. Similarly, his services can be terminated at any time by giving three months' notice.
- (v) If at any time Shri Sanjay Rajgarhia ceases to be Director of the Company for any reason whatsoever, he shall cease to be the Managing Director of the Company.
- (vi) Shri Sanjay Rajgarhia shall be entitled to reimbursement of all legitimate expenses incurred by him in performance of his duties and such reimbursement will not form part of his remuneration.
- (vii) In the event of absence or inadequacy of profits in any financial year, Shri Sanjay Rajgarhia will be paid salary and perquisites subject to the limits / conditions specified under Section II of Part II of Schedule V to the Companies Act, 2013.

The salary including allowances, perquisites and other benefits payable to him will be governed by the Company's policies & regulations, applicable from time to time.

The aggregate of the above salary, allowances, perquisite and other benefits as per Company policy shall not exceed Rs. 1.50 Crores per annum. For this purpose, the following shall not be included in the aggregate:-

- a. Contribution to Provident Fund
- b. Contribution to Gratuity Fund
- c. Encashment of leaves at the end of tenure

Minimum Remuneration

Subject to the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 read with applicable rules & schedule thereto and approval of the Shareholders, if required, the above remuneration shall be minimum remuneration payable to Shri Sanjay Rajgarhia in the event of absence or inadequacy of profits in any financial year during his tenure as a Managing Director.

RESOLVED FURTHER THAT the Board be and is hereby authorized to vary, alter, enhance or widen (collectively referred to as 'Variation') the scope of remuneration payable to Managing Director during his tenure to the extent permitted under Section 197 read with Schedule V and other applicable provisions, if any, of the Act, without being required to seek any further consent or approval of the members of the Company or otherwise to the end and intent that they shall be deemed to have given their approval thereto expressly by the authority of this resolution, provided however that any such Variation shall not exceed any amount permitted to be paid to Managing Director under applicable law without obtaining requisite approvals.

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RESOLVED FURTHER THAT the Board of the Company be and is hereby authorised to do all such acts, deeds and things as it may consider necessary, expedient or desirable, in order to give effect to the foregoing resolution or otherwise as considered by the Board to be in best interest of the Company."

- 1. The Ministry of Corporate Affairs ('MCA'), vide its Circular No. 10/2022 dated December 28, 2022 read with Circular No. 14/2020 dated April 08, 2020, Circular No. 17/2020 dated April 13, 2020, Circular No. 20/2020 dated May 05, 2020 and Circular No. 02/2022 dated May 05, 2022 (collectively referred as 'MCA Circulars') and SEBI Circular No. SEBI/HO/CFD/PoD-2/P/CIR/2023/4 dated January 5, 2023 and SEBI/HO/CFD/CMD2/CIR/P/2022/62 dated May 13, 2022 ('SEBI Circulars') (MCA Circulars and SEBI Circulars collectively referred as 'Circulars') permitted holding of Annual General Meetings through VC/OAVM facility and dispensed physical presence of the members at the meeting. In compliance with the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 ('the Act'), SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 ('Listing Regulations'), and Circulars, the 51st Annual General Meeting ('AGM') of the Members of the Company is being held through VC/OAVM. The detailed procedure for participating through VC/OAVM facility is mentioned in Note No. 20. The deemed venue for the AGM shall be the Registered Office of the Company. In compliance with the MCA Circulars, items of special business as mentioned in this Notice are considered unavoidable and forms part of this Notice.
- 2. The Explanatory Statement, pursuant to Section 102 of the Act, relating to the special business to be transacted at the 51st AGM, is annexed.

Further, the relevant details, pursuant to Regulations 36(3) of the Listing Regulations and Secretarial Standard-2 (SS-2) on "General Meetings" issued by the Institute of Company Secretaries of India, in respect of Directors seeking re-appointment at this AGM are also annexed to this Notice.

3. Since this AGM is being conducted through VC/OAVM, physical attendance of Members has been dispensed with. Accordingly, the facility for appointment of proxy by the Members under Section 105 of the Act will not be available for the AGM and hence the Proxy Form, Attendance Slip and Route Map are not annexed to this Notice.

However, in pursuance of Section 112 and Section 113 of the Act, Corporate Members are entitled to appoint their authorized representatives to attend the AGM through VC/OAVM on their behalf and to vote through electronic means.

- 4. The members attending the AGM through VC/OAVM facility shall be counted for the purpose of reckoning the quorum under Section 103 of the Act.
- 5. All the documents referred to in the accompanying Notice and Explanatory Statement, shall be available for inspection through electronic mode, basis the request being sent on <u>complianceofficer@perfectpac.com</u>.

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- 6. In case of joint holders, the Member whose name appears as the First holder in the order of names as per the Register of Members of the Company will be entitled to vote at the AGM.
- 7. As per the provisions of Section 72 of the Act and SEBI Circular, the facility for making a nomination is available for the members in respect of the shares held by them. Members who have not yet registered their nominations are requested to register the same by submitting Form No. SH-13. If a member desires to opt-out or cancel the earlier nomination and record a fresh nomination, he/ she may submit the same in Form ISR-3 or SH-14 as the case may be. The said forms can be downloaded from the Company's website https://perfectpac.com/updationofkyc.aspx. Members are requested to submit the said details to their Depository Participant in case the shares are held by them in dematerialized form and to Company's Registrar and Transfer Agent, Skyline Financial Services Private Limited ('RTA') in case the shares are held in physical form.
- The Register of Members and Shares Transfer Books of the Company shall remain closed from Tuesday, September 12, 2023 to Monday, September 18, 2023 (both days inclusive) for the purposes of the AGM and payment of Final Dividend, if approved by members.
- 9. The dividend, as recommended by the Board of Directors of the Company (Re. 1.00/- [i.e. 50%] per equity share of Rs. 2/- each for FY 2022-23), if approved at the AGM, will be paid/dispatched within 30 days from the date of AGM to those member(s) or their mandates:-
 - (a) whose names appear as Beneficial Owners at the end of business hours on Monday, September 11, 2023 in the lists of Beneficial Owners furnished by National Securities Depository Limited and Central Depository Services (India) Limited in respect of the shares held in electronic form;
 - (b) whose names appear as member(s) in the Register of members of the Company as on Monday, September 11, 2023. The dividend will be paid electronically through various online transfer modes to those members who have updated their bank account details. For members who have not updated their bank account details, dividend warrants/demand drafts/cheques will be sent out to their registered addresses.
- 10. Pursuant to the Finance Act, 2020, dividend income will be taxable in the hands of shareholders w.e.f. April 1, 2020 and the Company is required to deduct tax at source from the dividend paid to shareholders at the prescribed rates. For the prescribed rates for various categories, the shareholders are requested to refer to the Finance Act, 2020 and the amendments thereof. The shareholders are requested to ensure correct PAN details are provided to update their PAN with the Company/ RTA (in case of shares held in physical mode) and depositories (in case of shares held in demat mode).

A resident individual shareholder with PAN and who is not liable to pay income tax can submit a duly signed declaration in Form No. 15G/15H, to avail the benefit of non-deduction of tax at source by sending documents via e-mail at <u>complianceofficer@perfectpac.com</u> on or before **Saturday, September 16, 2023**. Shareholders are requested to note that in case their PAN is not registered or valid, the tax will be deducted at a higher rate of 20%.

For resident shareholders (other than an individual) holding a valid PAN and not subject to withholding under Section 194 of the Income Tax Act, 1961, can submit duly signed declaration along with other documents as sought separately to avail benefit of non-deduction of tax at source by sending documents via e-mail at <u>complianceofficer@perfectpac.com</u> on or before **Saturday, September 16, 2023**. Shareholders are requested to note that in case their PAN is not registered or valid, the tax will be deducted at a higher rate of 20%.

For a Non-resident shareholder [including Foreign Portfolio Investors ('FPI')], applicable withholding tax rate is either 20% as per the Income Tax Act or the tax rate as specified in the tax treaty, whichever being more beneficial to the Non-resident shareholder. Further, Non-resident shareholders can avail of the beneficial rates under tax treaty between India and their country of residence, subject to providing necessary documents i.e. No Permanent Establishment and Beneficial Ownership Declaration, Tax Residency Certificate, Form 10F, any other document which may be required to avail the tax treaty benefits by sending the documents through above mentioned email id. The aforesaid declarations and documents need to be submitted by the shareholders latest by Saturday, September 16, 2023.

Additionally, for shareholders who qualify as 'specified person' as defined under Section 206AB of the Income Tax Act, 1961, tax shall be deducted at a higher rate.

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- 11. Members are requested to note that, dividends if not encashed or remaining unclaimed in Company's Unpaid Dividend Account, are liable to be transferred to the Investor Education and Protection Fund ('IEPF') established by the Central Government. Further, all shares in respect of which dividend has remained unclaimed for 7 consecutive years or more from the date of transfer to unpaid dividend account are also liable to be transferred to IEPF Authority in terms of Section 124 of the Act read with IEPF Rules made thereunder. In view of this, Members are requested to claim their dividends from the Company, within the stipulated timeline. 15. SEBI vide its Circular No. SEBI/HO/MIRSD/MIRSD-PoD-1/P/CIR/2023/37 dated March 16, 2023, in supersession of earlier Circular(s) issued on the subject, has prescribed common and simplified norms for processing investor's service request by RTAs and norms for furnishing PAN, KYC (Contact Details, Bank Details and Specimen Signature) and Nomination details.

As per said Circular, it is mandatory for the shareholders holding securities in physical form to, inter alia, furnish PAN, KYC and Nomination details. Physical folios wherein the PAN, KYC and Nomination details were not available on or after April 01, 2023 were to be frozen by the RTA and would be eligible for lodging grievance or any service request only after registering the required details. The said timeline of April 01, 2023 for freezing of folios has been extended to October 01, 2023.

Dividend and other payments, if any, in respect of such frozen folios shall only be made electronically with effect from April 01, 2024 upon registering the required details. The said physical folios shall be referred by the Company or RTA to the administering authority under the Benami Transactions (Prohibition) Act, 1988 and/or Prevention of Money Laundering Act, 2002, if they continue to remain frozen as on December 31, 2025.

If a shareholder holding shares in physical form desires to opt out or cancel the earlier nomination and record a fresh nomination, he/she may submit the same in the prescribed form.

The shareholders holding shares in electronic form who have either not furnished nomination or submitted declaration for opting out of nomination, are required to register or opt out from nomination, as the case may be, on or before September 30, 2023, failing which their trading accounts shall be frozen for trading and demat account shall be frozen for debits.

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The Company has sent individual letters in the month of May 2023 to all the members holding shares of the Company in physical form for furnishing their PAN, KYC and Nomination details. The relevant Circular(s) and necessary forms in this regard have been made available on the website of the Company at https://perfectpac.com/updationofkyc.aspx.

Accordingly, the members are advised to register their details with the RTA or DP, as the case may be, in compliance with the aforesaid SEBI guidelines for smooth processing of their service requests and trading without any hindrance.

- 16. SEBI vide its Circular No. SEBI/HO/MIRSD/MIRSD_RTAMB/P/CIR/2022/8 dated January 25, 2022 has mandated the listed companies to issue securities in dematerialized form only while processing service requests viz. Issue of duplicate securities certificate; claim from unclaimed suspense account; renewal/ exchange of securities certificate; endorsement; sub-division/splitting of securities certificate; consolidation of securities certificates/folios; transmission and transposition. Accordingly, Members are requested to make service requests by submitting a duly filled and signed Form ISR 4, the format of which is available on the Company's website at https://www.perfectpac.com/updationofkyc.aspx and on the website of the Company's RTA at https://www.skylinerta.com/investor-charter.php. It may be noted that any service request can be processed only after the folio is KYC Compliant.
- 17. SEBI vide its notification dated January 24, 2022 has mandated that all requests for transfer of securities including transmission and transposition requests shall be processed only in dematerialized form. In view of the same and to eliminate all risks associated with physical shares and avail various benefits of dematerialisation. Members are advised to dematerialise the shares held by them in physical form. Members can contact the Company or RTA, for assistance in this regard.
- 18. 20. Instructions for Members for e-Voting and joining the AGM are as follows:-

- (i) In compliance with the provisions of Section 108 of the Act read with Rule 20 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014, as amended from time to time, Regulation 44 of the Listing Regulations, as amended, and applicable Circulars, the members are provided with the facility to cast their vote electronically, through the remote e-Voting facility (before the AGM) and e-Voting facility (at the AGM), on all the resolutions set forth in this Notice. The facility of casting votes will be provided by National Securities Depository Limited (NSDL).
- (ii) The remote e-Voting period commences on Friday, September 15, 2023 (09:00 A.M. IST) and ends on Sunday, September 17, 2023 (05:00 P.M. IST). During this period, member(s) of the Company, holding shares either in physical form or in dematerialised form, as on the cut-off date on Monday, September 11, 2023, may cast their vote electronically. The remote e-Voting module shall be disabled by NSDL for voting thereafter. Once the vote on a resolution is cast by the member, the member shall not be allowed to change it subsequently.
- (iii) The voting rights of member(s) for remote e-Voting and for e-Voting at AGM shall be in proportion to their shares in the paid up equity share capital of the Company as on the cut-off date i.e. Monday, September 11, 2023. A person whose name is recorded in the register of members or in the register of beneficial owners maintained by the depositories as on the cut-off date, i.e. Monday, September 11, 2023 only shall be entitled to vote through remote e-Voting/e-Voting at the AGM. Any person who is not a member as on the cut-off date should treat this Notice for information purpose only.
- (iv) Any person, who acquires shares of the Company and becomes a Member of the Company after the Company sends the AGM Notice and holding shares as of the cut-off date, may obtain the login ID and

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password by sending a request at <u>evoting@nsdl.co.in</u> or <u>admin@skylinerta.com</u> by mentioning their Folio No./DP Id and Client Id for casting their vote. However, if he/she is already registered with NSDL for remote e-voting then he/she can use his/her existing User ID and password for casting the vote.

- (v) The members can opt for only one mode of voting i.e. remote e-Voting or e-Voting at the AGM. In case of voting by both the modes, vote cast through remote e-Voting will be considered final and e-Voting at the AGM will not be considered.
- (vi) The Members who have cast their vote by remote e-voting prior to the AGM may also attend/participate in the AGM through VC/OAVM but shall not be entitled to cast their e-vote again.

Step 1: Access to NSDL e-Voting system

Pursuant to SEBI Circular no. SEBI/HO/CFD/CMD/CIR/P/2020/242 dated December 9, 2020 on "e-voting facility provided by Listed Companies", e-voting process has been enabled to all the individual demat account holders, by way of single login credential, through their demat accounts/websites of Depositories/ DPs to increase the efficiency of the voting process. Individual demat account holders would be able to cast their vote without having to register again with the E-voting Service Provider ("ESP") thereby not only facilitating seamless authentication but also ease and convenience of participating in e-voting process. 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EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

Pursuant to the provision of Regulation 17(1A) of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended vide Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) (Amendment) Regulations, 2018, with effect from April 01, 2019, no listed Company shall appoint or continue the directorship of a Non-Executive Director who has attained the age of 75 (Seventy Five) years, unless a Special Resolution is passed to that effect and justification thereof is indicated in the explanatory statement annexed to the Notice for such appointment.

Shri Rajendra Kumar Rajgarhia (DIN: 00141766), has attained the age of 75 years in August 2013. The members of the Company have approved his continuation as Non-Executive Director on the Board of the Company through Postal Ballot dated March 30, 2019. In terms of provisions of Section 152 of the Companies Act, 2013, Shri Rajendra Kumar Rajgarhia is liable to retire by rotation and being eligible, offers himself for re-appointment. 2. STATE OF COMPANY AFFAIRS & OPERATIONS

The Company is engaged in the business of manufacture of packaging material and operates in one sector only. For the FY 2022-23, the Company has reported significantly improved results. The total revenue was Rs. 10,004.14 lakhs as against Rs. 8,872.91 lakhs in the previous year, net profit was Rs. 283.20 lakhs as against Rs. 103.01 lakhs in the previous year and basic and diluted EPS increased to Rs. 4.25 as against Rs. 1.55 in the previous year.

Your Directors are hopeful of further improvement in the working results during the current year barring any unforeseen circumstances.

3. CHANGE IN THE NATURE OF BUSINESS, IF ANY

There is no change in the nature of business of your Company during the year under review.

4. TRANSFER TO RESERVES

The Board does not transfer any amount out of the profit for the year under review to the General Reserve.

5. <u>DIVIDEND</u>

The Board of Directors at its meeting held on August 10, 2022 had paid an interim dividend of Rs. 5/- (i.e. 50%) per equity share on face value of Rs. 10/- each was paid during the FY 2022-23. The Directors are pleased to recommend a final dividend of Re. 1 (i.e. 50%) per equity share of Rs. 2/- each fully paid up. The payment of the final dividend is subject to the approval of the shareholders at the forthcoming Annual General Meeting of the Company and shall be subject to deduction of tax at source. After payment of the final dividend, the total dividend payment for FY 2022-23 will be 100%.

6. CAPITAL STRUCTURE

Authorised Share Capital

The Authorised Equity Share Capital of the Company as at March 31, 2023 was Rs. 2,00,00,000/- comprising of 1,00,00,000 equity shares of Rs. 2/- each and Preference Share Capital was Rs. 1,25,00,000/- comprising of 1,25,000 preference shares of Rs. 100 each i.e. total authorised share capital was Rs. 3,25,00,000.

Paid up Share Capital

The Paid-up share capital as at March 31, 2023 stands at Rs. 1,33,19,000/- comprising of 66,59,500 equity shares of Rs. 2/- each fully paid up.

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During FY 2022-23, your Board of Directors approved split/ sub-division of equity shares of the Company such that each equity share having face value of Rs. 10/- (Rupees Ten only) fully paid-up, be sub-divided into five (5) equity shares having face value of Rs. 2/- (Rupees Two only) each, fully paid-up with effect from October 21, 2022 (Record Date). Further, the shareholders at its 50th Annual General Meeting held on September 15, 2022 approved the said split of equity shares and the consequential alteration in Capital Clause of Memorandum of Association and Article of Association of the Company.

7. <u>SUBSIDIARIES/JOINT VENTURES/ASSOCIATE COMPANIES</u>

The Company doesn't have any subsidiary, joint venture or associate Company.

8. DIRECTORS AND KEY MANAGERIAL PERSONNEL

Appointment, Re-appointment and Resignation

Shri Rajendra Kumar Rajgarhia will retire at the ensuing Annual General Meeting (AGM) and being eligible, has offered himself for re-appointment. The Board recommends his re-appointment to the members in the forthcoming AGM. Brief resume of Shri Rajendra Kumar Rajgarhia with other details as stipulated in Regulation 36(3) of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 ("Listing Regulations"), are provided in the Notice convening the 51st AGM.

Shri Sanjay Rajgarhia, Managing Director of the Company will complete his term as Managing Director on June 30, 2024. Pursuant to the provisions of Companies Act, 2013, Articles of Association of the Company and based on the recommendation of the Nomination and Remuneration Committee, the Board of Directors at its meeting held on July 28, 2023 approved the re-appointment of Shri Sanjay Rajgarhia as Managing Director for a further period of three years w.e.f. July 01, 2024 to June 30, 2027, subject to the approval of the members of the Company by Special Resolution.

During the period under review, Ms. Shefali Chauhan, Company Secretary and Compliance Officer, has resigned from the Company with effective from July 23, 2022. In order to fill the vacancy caused due to the resignation of Ms. Shefali Chauhan, the Board in its Meeting held on January 20, 2023 has appointed Mrs. Nidhi as the Company Secretary and Compliance Officer of the Company.

Declaration by Independent Directors

All the Independent Directors of the Company have given their declaration to the Company under Section 149(7) of the Companies Act, 2013 that they meet the criteria of independence as provided under Section 149(6) of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Regulation 16(1)(b) of the Listing Regulations and are not disqualified from continuing as Independent Directors and that they have registered themselves as an Independent Director in the data bank maintained with the Indian Institute of Corporate Affairs. The Company has also received declaration from the Independent Directors that they have complied with the code of conduct of Directors and Senior Management. Based on the disclosures received, the Board is of the opinion that, all the Independent Directors fulfill the conditions specified in the Companies Act, 2013 and Listing Regulations and are independent of the management.

Annual Performance Evaluation of the Board

The Board adopted a formal mechanism for evaluating its performance and as well as that of its Committees and individual Directors, including the Chairperson of the Board. The evaluation was carried out through a structured questionnaire covering various aspects of the functioning of Board and its Committees. Presently, the equity shares of the Company are listed only on BSE Limited.







MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS REPORT

[Schedule V – Regulation 34(3) of SEBI (LODR) Regulations, 2015]

1. INDUSTRY STRUCTURE AND DEVELOPMENTS

The packaging industry has tremendous potential for growth in India and the segment has expanded drastically, spurred by the rapid growth in consumer markets. The processed food, personal care, and pharmaceutical end-user industries and other such segments have provide a big boost for the sector. Packaging in India's one of the fastest growing sectors. Over the last few years, the industry has been a key driver of technology and innovation, contributing to various manufacturing sectors, including agriculture and the fast-moving consumer goods (FMCG) sectors. The packaging industry is driven by the factors such as rising population, increasing income levels, and changing lifestyles are anticipated to drive consumption across various industries leading to higher demand for packaging product solutions.

Given the environmental impact of certain packaging materials, consumers world-wide are becoming very eco-sensitive. Accordingly, all manufacturers are looking towards opportunities to become more eco-friendly and adopt sustainable solutions. On the other hand, stringent regulations concerning packaging restrain the growth to some extent. As an industry, corrugated packaging is robust and growing rapidly, with innovation, sustainability and market differentiation driving growth. It is a trend that continues to gain great popularity. The widespread adoption of e-commerce transactions/shopping has resulted in millions of packets being delivered daily across the country. This has further increased the demand for quality packaging material. India's large population and huge domestic consumption augur well for our Industry.

The Industry suffers from excess capacity and is highly fragmented. Hence, Raw Material price volatility and increase in manufacturing costs are difficult to pass on to the customers.

3. SEGMENT-WISE PERFORMANCE

The Company currently has only one segment of business i.e., Packaging. Hence, segment-wise or productwise performance is not provided. The Company has no activity outside India. Therefore, there is no geographical segment.

4. <u>OUTLOOK</u>

Your Company's priorities have always revolved around service to our customers and maintaining the quality of our end product. We continue to work towards making these strategies our priority by modernizing plant and machinery and by adding balancing equipment to improve quality and production capacity of our products.

The packaging industry is driven by the factors such as rising population, increasing income levels, and changing lifestyles are anticipated to drive consumption across various industries leading to higher demand for packaging product solutions. Moreover, demand from the rural sector for packaged products is fueled by the growing media penetration through the internet and television.

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The Indian packaging market is expected to register a healthier growth during the coming years. We feel that factors such as increasing demand from industries of fresh food and beverages, home & personal care goods, and electronic goods, logistics application, increasing consumer awareness towards sustainable packaging, and growth of the e-commerce industry will propel the growth of the corrugated boxes market.

5. RISKS & CONCERNS

Effective risk management is integral to the Company's operations and is embedded in its day-to-day business transactions and activities. NOTES FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1A. Corporate Information

Perfectpac Limited ("the Company") is a public limited Company incorporated in India with its Registered Office at Delhi and is listed on the Bombay Stock Exchange Limited (BSE). The Company is engaged inter-alia, in the business of manufacturing of Packaging products.

1B. Significant Accounting Policies

The significant accounting policies applied by the Company in the preparation of its Financial Statements are listed below. Such accounting policies have been applied consistently to all the periods presented in these Financial Statements.

(a) Statement of Compliance

The Financial Statements have been prepared as a going concern in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") including the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules,2015 (as amended from time to time) and presentation requirements of Division II of Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013, (Ind AS compliant) as applicable to the financial statements.

(b) (i) Basis for Preparation & Presentation

The Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention on accrual basis with the exception of certain assets and liabilities carried at fair values. The Assets and Liabilities have been classified as Current/Non-Current as per the Company's normal operating cycle and other criteria set out in the Act. Based on the nature of products and the time between the acquisition of assets for processing and their realization in cash and cash equivalents, the Company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of Current/Non-Current classification of Assets and Liabilities. The statement of Cash Flows has been prepared under indirect method.

(ii) Use of Estimates and Critical Accounting Judgements

The preparation of Financial Statements is in conformity with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles which requires management to make estimates and assumptions.

The estimates and the associated assumptions are based on historical experience, opinions of experts and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Significant judgements and estimates are made in areas relating to useful life of Property, Plant and Equipment, impairment of Property, Plant and Equipment, Investments, actuarial assumptions relating to recognition and measurement of employee defined benefit obligations and recognition of provisions and exposure of contingent liabilities relating to pending litigations or other outstanding claims etc.

(c) Property, Plant and Equipment-Tangible Assets

Property, Plant and Equipment are stated at cost, net of recoverable taxes, trade discounts and rebates less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any. Such cost includes purchase price, borrowing cost and any cost directly attributable to bringing the assets to its working condition for its intended use, net changes on foreign exchange contracts and adjustments arising from exchange rate variations attributable to the assets.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognized as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the entity and the cost can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance are charged to the Statement of profit and loss during the reporting period in which they are incurred.

An item of Property, Plant and Equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected to arise from continued use of asset.

Depreciation Method and Estimated Useful Life

i. Depreciation is calculated using the straight-line method on a pro-rata basis from the date on which each asset is available for use to allocate their cost net of their residual values, over their estimated useful lives. The estimated useful lives are those prescribed under Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013.

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- ii. Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with carrying amount and such gains or losses are recognized as income or expense in the Statement of Profit and Loss.
- iii. Cost of items of Property, Plant and Equipment not ready for intended use as on the Balance Sheet date is disclosed as capital work in progress. Advances given towards acquisition of Property, Plant and Equipment outstanding at each Balance Sheet date are disclosed as Capital Advance under Other Non Current Assets.

(d) Intangible Assets and Amortization

Intangible assets are stated at cost, net of recoverable taxes, trade discounts and rebates less accumulated amortization and impairment loss, if any. The cost comprises of purchase price, borrowing costs and any cost directly attributable to bringing the asset to its working condition for the intended use.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with carrying amount. These are recognized as income or expense in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

Cost of items of intangible assets not ready for intended use as on the Balance Sheet date is disclosed as intangible assets under development.

An intangible asset is derecognised when no future benefits are expected from use.

Amortization Method and Estimated Useful Life

Amortization is charged on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful life. The estimated useful life and amortization method is reviewed at the end of each annual reporting period with the effect of any changes in the estimate being accounted for on a prospective basis.

(e) Impairment

Tangible and Intangible assets are tested for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognized for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use. Non-financial assets that suffered an impairment are reviewed for possible reversal of the impairment at the end of each reporting period.

(f) Leases

Company as a lessor:

The Company classifies the leases as either a finance lease or an operating lease depending on whether the risks and rewards incidental to ownership of an underlying asset are transferred and recognizes finance income over the lease term.

Company as a lessee:

In accordance with Ind AS-116, the Company assesses whether a contract contains a lease at inception of a contract. At the date of commencement of the lease, the Company recognizes a "right of use" asset and a corresponding liability for all lease arrangements in which it is the lessee, except for leases with a term of twelve months or less(short term leases) and low value leases. For these short term and low value leases, the Company recognizes the lease payments as an operating expense on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease. The right of use assets are depreciated using the straight line method from the commencement date over the shorter of lease term or useful life of right to use asset. The lease payments are discounted using the interest rate implicit in the lease or if not readily determinable using the incremental borrowing rates. Lease Liabilities are re measured with a corresponding adjustment to the related right of use asset if the Company changes its assessment of whether it will exercise an extension or termination option.

g) Financial Instruments

Financial Assets and Financial Liabilities are recognized when the Company becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the relevant instrument. Since the transaction price does not differ significantly from the fair value of the financial asset or financial liability, the transaction price is assumed to be the fair value on initial recognition.Transaction costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition or issue of financial assets and financial liabilities are added to or deducted from the fair value on initial recognition of financial assets or financial assets are recognized using trade date accounting.

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i. Financial Assets

Financial assets include Trade Receivables, Advances, Security Deposits, Cash and Cash Equivalents etc which are classified for measurement at amortized cost. The Company accounts its investments in subsidiaries and associates at cost. However, all other equity investments are measured at fair value, with value changes recognized through "Other Comprehensive Income."

Management determines the classification of an asset at initial recognition depending on the purpose for which the assets were acquired. The subsequent measurement of financial assets depends on such classification.

Impairment:

The Company assesses at each reporting date whether a financial asset (or a group of financial assets) are tested for impairment based on available evidence or information. Expected credit losses are assessed and loss allowances recognized if the credit quality of the financial asset has deteriorated significantly since initial recognition.

De-Recognition:

Financial assets are derecognized when the right to receive cash flow from the assets has expired, or has been transferred and the Company has transferred substantially all of the risks and rewards of ownership.

Income Recognition:

Interest income is recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss using the effective interest method. Dividend income is recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss when the right to receive the same is established.

ii. Financial Liabilities:

Borrowings, Trade Payables and other Financial Liabilities are initially recognized at the value of the respective contractual obligations. They are subsequently measured at amortized cost using the effective interest method.

For trade and other payables maturing within one year from the Balance Sheet date, the carrying amounts approximate fair value due to short maturity of these instruments.

De-Recognition:

Financial Liabilities are derecognized when the liability is extinguished, that is, when the contractual obligation is discharged, cancelled and on expiry.

(h) Inventories

Inventories are valued at lower of cost and net realizable value except waste which is valued at estimated realizable value as certified by the management. The basis of determining cost for various categories of inventories are as follows:

Stores, Spare Parts, Packing Materials and Raw Materials	First in First out basis.
Work in Progress and Finished Goods	Material cost plus appropriate share of production overheads.
Waste & Scrap	At estimated realizable value.

(i) Revenue

Revenue is recognized when the performance obligation is satisfied by transferring promised goods or services (*i.e.* an asset) to a customer. An asset is transferred when (or as) the customer obtains control of that asset. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable net of discounts, taking into account contractually defined terms and excluding taxes and duties collected on behalf of the Government. Dividend income from investments is recognized when the right to receive payment has been established. Interest income is accrued on time proportion basis, by reference to the principal outstanding and the effective interest rate applicable. Rental income from investment properties is recognized on a straight line basis over the term of the relevant leases. Income from services is accounted over the period of rendering of services.

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(j) Foreign Currency Transactions

Items included in the Financial Statements are measured using the currency of the primary economic environment in which the entity operates (the functional currency). The Ind AS Financial Statements are presented in Indian Rupee (INR) which is Company's functional and presentation currency.

Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the exchange rates at the dates of the transactions. Foreign exchange gains and losses resulting from the settlement of such transactions and from the translation of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at year end exchange rates are generally recognized in Statement of Profit and Loss except on transactions entered into to hedge certain foreign currency risks.

Exchange gains or losses on foreign currency borrowings taken prior to 1st April, 2017 which are related to the acquisition or construction of qualifying assets are adjusted in the carrying cost of such assets.

(k) Cash and Cash Equivalents

For the purpose of presentation in the statement of Cash Flows, Cash and Cash Equivalents includes cash in hand, cheques/drafts in hand, demand deposits with banks, short term balances, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to insignificant risk of changes in value. Book overdrafts are shown within Other Financial Liabilities in the Balance Sheet and form part of Cash and Cash Equivalents in the Cash Flow Statement.

(I) Income Tax

Income tax expense represents the sum of the current tax and deferred tax.

Current tax charge is based on taxable profit for the year. Taxable profit differs from profit as reported in the Statement of Profit and Loss because some items of income or expense are taxable or deductible in different years or may never be taxable or deductible. The Company's liability for current tax is calculated using Indian tax rates and laws that have been enacted by the reporting date.

Current tax assets and liabilities are offset when there is a legally enforceable right to set off current tax assets against current tax liabilities and when they relate to income taxes levied by the same taxation authority.

The Company periodically evaluates positions taken in the tax returns with respect to situations in which applicable tax regulations are subject to interpretation and establishes provisions where appropriate.

Deferred tax is the tax arising from temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the Balance Sheet and the corresponding tax bases used in the computation of taxable profit. Deferred tax liabilities are generally recognized for all taxable temporary differences and deferred tax assets are recognized to the extent that it is probable that taxable profits will be available against which deductible temporary differences can be utilized. Deferred tax is calculated at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the period when the liability is settled or the asset realized, based on tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date.

Deferred income tax assets and liabilities are off set against each other and the resultant net amount is presented in the Balance Sheet if and only when the Company currently has a legally enforceable right to set off the current income tax assets and liabilities.

Deferred tax assets include Minimum Alternate Tax (MAT) paid in accordance with the tax laws in India, to the extent it would be available for set off against future current income tax liability. Accordingly, MAT is recognised as deferred tax asset in the Balance Sheet when the asset can be measured reliably and it is probable that the future economic benefit associated with the asset will be realised.

Current and deferred tax is recognized in profit or loss, except to the extent that it relates to items recognized in Other Comprehensive Income or directly in equity. In this case the tax is also recognized in Other Comprehensive Income or directly in equity respectively.

(m) Employee Benefits

(i) Short Term Employee Benefits

Short term employee benefits are expensed as the related service is provided. A liability is recognized for the amount expected to be paid if the Company has a present legal or constructive obligation to pay this amount as a result of past service provided by the employee and the obligation can be estimated reliably.

(ii) Post Employment Benefits

Defined Contribution Plans

The Company's defined contribution plans are Superannuation and Employees Provident Fund, Employee State Insurance/ Labour Fund and Employees Pension Scheme (under the provisions of the Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952) since the Company has no further obligation beyond making the contributions. The Company's contributions to these plans are charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss as incurred.

Defined Benefits Plans

Liability for defined benefit plans is provided on the basis of valuations as at the Balance Sheet date, carried out by an independent actuary.

Gratuity

The gratuity fund benefits are administered by a Trust recognized by Income Tax Authorities through Group Gratuity Schemes. The liability for gratuity at the end of the each financial year is determined on the basis of actuarial valuation carried out by the independent Actuary. The method used for measuring the liability for gratuity is Projected Unit Credit Method. Actuarial gains and losses are recognized in the Statement of Other Comprehensive Income in the period of occurrence of such gains and losses. The obligations for gratuity are measured at the present value of estimated future cash flows discounted at rates reflecting the prevailing market yields of Indian Government securities as at the Balance Sheet date for the estimated term of the obligations. The estimate of future salary increases considered takes into account the inflation, seniority, promotion and other relevant factors. The expected rate of return of plan assets is the Company's expectation of the average long term rate of return expected on investments of the fund during the estimated term of the obligations. Plan assets are measured at fair value as at the Balance Sheet date.

(iii) Other Long Term Benefit Plans

The liabilities for earned leave are not expected to be settled wholly within 12 months after the end of the period in which the employees render the related service. They are therefore measured as the present value of expected future payments to be made in respect of services provided by employees up to the end of the reporting period using the Projected Unit Credit Method. The benefits are discounted using the market yields at the end of the reporting period that have terms approximating to the terms of the related obligation. Remeasurements as a result of experience adjustments and changes in actuarial assumptions are recognized in Other Comprehensive Income.

(n) Earnings Per Share

Basic earnings per Share is calculated by dividing the profit for the period attributable to the owners of Company by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period. The weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period and for all periods presented is adjusted for events, such as bonus shares, other than the conversion of potential equity shares that have changed the number of equity shares outstanding without a corresponding change in resources. For the purposes of calculating diluted earnings per share the profit for the period attributable to the owners of the Company and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period is adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

(o) Exceptional Items

When items of income or expense are of such nature, size and incidence that their disclosure is necessary to explain the performance of the Company for the year, the Company makes a disclosure of the nature and amount of such items separately under the head "Exceptional Items."

(p) Provisions and Contingent Liabilities

A provision is recognized if as a result of a past event, the Company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) that can be estimated reliably and it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation. Provisions are recognized at the best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the present obligation at the Balance Sheet date. If the effect of time value of money is material, provisions are discounted using a current pre tax rate that reflects, when appropriate the risks specific to the liability.

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A contingent liability exists when there is a possible but not probable obligation, or a present obligation that may, but probably will not, require an outflow of resources, or a present obligation whose amount cannot be estimated reliably. Contingent liabilities do not warrant provisions but are disclosed unless the possibility of outflow of resources is remote. Contingent assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in the Ind AS Financial Statements. However, when the realization of income is virtually certain then the related asset is not a contingent asset and its recognition is appropriate.

(q) Rounding of Amounts

All amounts disclosed in the Financial Statements and accompanying notes have been rounded off to the nearest lakhs as per the requirement of Schedule III of the Companies Act, 2013 unless otherwise stated.

(r) Dividends

Dividend proposed (including income tax thereon) is recognized in the period in which interim dividends are approved by the Board of Directors or in respect of final dividend when approved by shareholders.

(s) Borrowing Cost

Borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition or construction of qualifying assets are capitalized as part of the cost of such assets. A qualifying asset is one that necessarily takes substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use. All other borrowing costs are charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss for the period for which they are incurred.

(t) Recent Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS)

Ministry of Corporate Affairs notifies new Standards or amendments to the existing Standards. On March 31,2023, MCA issued the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2023, applicable from April 1,2023 and has made limited revisions/amendments to Ind AS 1, Ind AS 8, Ind AS 102, Ind AS 103, Ind AS 109 and Ind AS 115. The Company does not expect the amendments to have any significant impact in its financial statements.

c) Financial Risk Management

In the course of its business, the Company is exposed to a number of financial risks: credit risk, liquidity risk, market risk. This note presents the Company's objectives, policies and processes for managing its financial risk and capital.

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NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED MARCH 31, 2023

i) Credit Risk

Credit risk is the risk of financial loss to the Company if a customer or counterparty to a financial instrument fails to meet its contractual obligations, and arises principally from the Company's receivables from customers.

Trade and other receivables

The Company's Trade Receivables are largely from sales made to wholesale customers. The Company's exposure to credit risk is influenced mainly by the individual characteristics of each customer, deomgraphics of the customer and the default risk of the industry.

The Company manages credit risk through credit approvals, establishing credit limits and continuously monitoring the creditworthiness of customers to which the Company grants credit terms in the normal course of business.

Exposoures to customers outstanding at the end of each reporting period are reviewed to determine incurred and expected credit losses and the Company establishes an allowance for doubtful debts and impairment that represents its estimate of expected losses in respect of trade receivables. Historical trends of impairment of Trade Receivables do not reflect any significant losses.
